I am grateful for the dedication shown by pastors and parishes that are committed to a strong Catholic identity as we form the child in knowledge, faith, and service."

Cognia, formerly AdvancED, nationally recognizes districts meeting rigorous standards that focus on productive learning environments, equitable resource allocation which meet the needs of learners, and effective leadership. Earning accreditation from the Cognia Global Accreditation Commission means that all the Catholic schools of the Diocese of Gary are accredited and recognized across the nation as a school system that meets the Cognia Standards of Quality and maintains a commitment to continuous improvement.

"Accreditation as conferred by the Cognia Global Accreditation Commission affirms that each one of our schools are nationally recognized for the quality of the educational institution," remarked Dr. Joseph Majchrowicz, Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Gary. "It demonstrates our commitment to excellence, our openness to external review and feedback, and our desire to be the best we can be on behalf of the students we serve."

To earn accreditation from Cognia, a school district must implement a continuous process of improvement and submit to internal and external review. School systems in good standing can maintain their accreditation for a five-year term.

Elgart, president and CEO of Cognia, stated, "Cognia System Accreditation is a rigorous process that focuses the entire school system and its community on the primary goal of preparing lifelong learners in engaging environments where all students can flourish.
